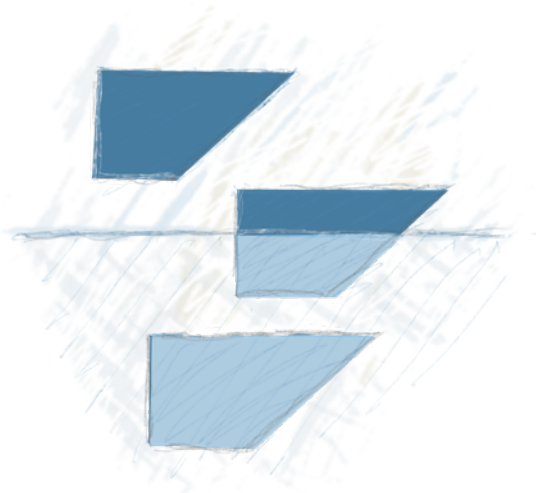
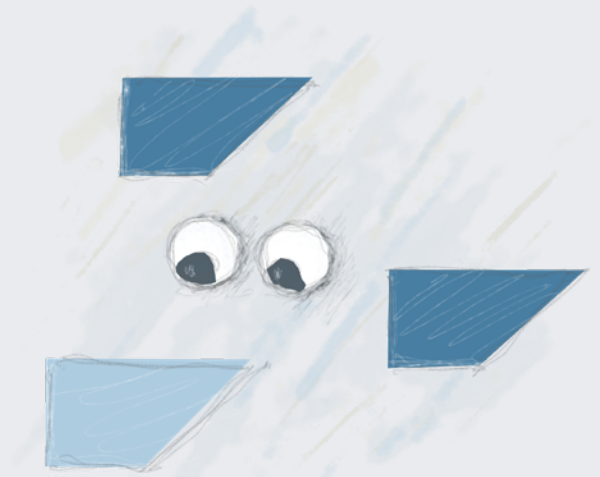
1. Transparency

Without a specialized tool, SAP lacks the ability to comprehensively monitor license usage. DLC monitors your license requirements across your entire SAP landscape.



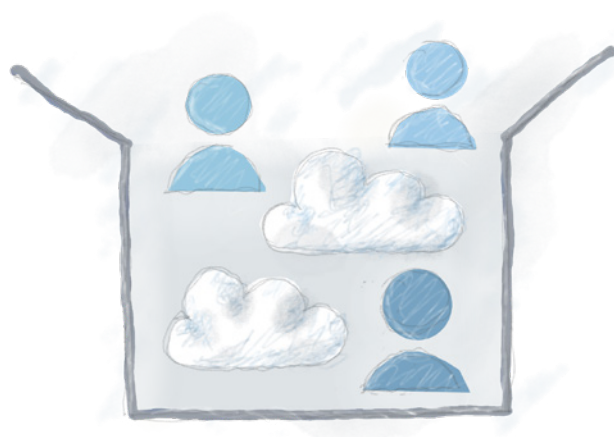
3. License Optimization

For volume-based cloud metrics, however, comparable flexibility must first be contractually negotiated.

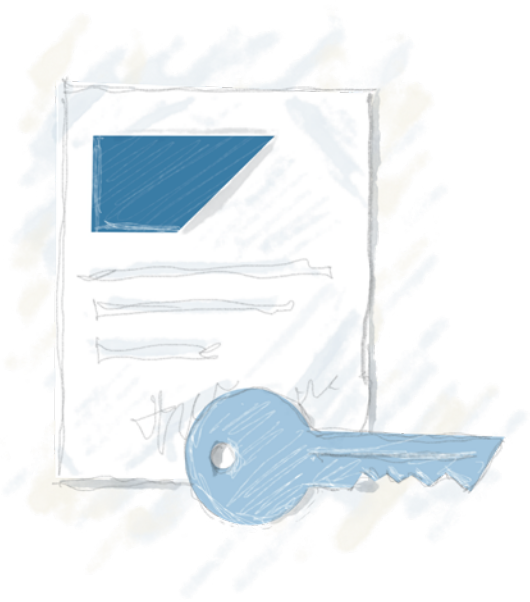


6. Contract Management
